Over the years it has been left abandoned and become overgrown. The young members of one of the local youth clubs, with the supervision of the youth development team have been working very hard into bringing life back to Polly's Garden.

This has now become an area that has been revitalised and the young people from Bentilee youth club have agreed to maintain the raised beds, to enable the area to be used more by the nursery groups that visit the Children's Centre

Bentilee Volunteers

Bentilee Volunteers is located in the middle of Bentilee who offer invaluable services to the residents of Bentilee and Stoke-on-Trent. Their overarching aim is to be at the heart of our community by providing vital support and services that help to raise aspirations, enable and empower local people, support the disadvantaged and improve overall quality of life.

The services they currently offer include a Youth Club, Seniors' Lunch Club and a social club for adults with learning disabilities.

The team that are involved in Bentilee in Bloom are Youth link, which is a club for young people aged between 7 and 13 years. They have created colourful flowers to decorate the windows of the Pavilion which is situated in Bentilee Park.







St Maria Goretti Catholic Academy

The staff at St Maria Goretti Catholic Academy are very proud of the "family" atmosphere and culture of their school. The culture is firmly embedded, enabling children of all faiths, abilities and personalities to thrive and succeed.

The young children from St Maria Goretti Catholic School along with their parents have started a gardening club. They have built and painted new raised planters, encouraged participation in growing plants, improved health and exercise along with the young people taking part in taster sessions of the food they have grown, such as salad tasters.

2019 & beyond Bentilee in Bloom Plans

Bentilee Neighbourhood Centre



Bentilee Neighbourhood Centre was the first of its kind built in the city of Stoke-on-Trent. It was built to provide all services under one roof from health care, housing, library and the community. It is situated in the heart of the Bentilee and Ubberley Ward. From the success of the community involvement of the residents of Bentilee, the group would like to improve the outdoor appearance of the land surrounding the centre, so this will be part of the plans for 2019.



The Meadows

The Meadows offers accommodation for persons who require nursing or personal care, or who are sufferers of Dementia, Learning disabilities, mental health conditions or physical disabilities.



For 2019 the young students from The Discovery Academy, would like to get involved in an intergenerational project, visiting the scheme, provide an activity with the resident to plant up the external grounds to provide a colourful area for the residents to sit out in or view from indoors.

St Stephens Community Church Dawlish Drive

St Stephens Community Church is at the heart of Bentilee

Streetwise is a youth club, which is one of the activities that is run from the Community Church, which is for young people aged from 11 to 17. These young people have come up with a plan to create a remembrance garden by installing flower beds on the small piece of land under the church windows within the church gardens to provide a peaceful haven for residents to visit.



Maple Court Academy

Maple Court Academy is situated in the community of Bentilee and the school prides itself on its welcoming environment and has extensively refurbished the interior and exterior of the building over the last two years. The school has high aspirations for every child every day and truly believes there is no limit to the potential of their pupils. The motto of the school is "Expect Excellence. Achieve Excellence"

The school children have been working with their parents to start a gardening club of which they have created lots of hanging baskets that will be hung around the school, in particular in an area called the Quadrangle. There is also an area of scrub land that is situated at the rear of the school which is going to be part of a bigger plan to turn this space into an outdoor education area in partnership with the Discovery Academy. This area will also incorporate an area for community use.

Work has started on the site, the volunteers and staff have cleared some of the land and erected a poly tunnel and incorporated new pathways.

This project is one that is in its infancy stages, and will be one of the projects for Bentilee in Bloom in 2019 and beyond







The Discovery Academy

The Discovery Academy has a number of new projects that will start from the new term in September 2018.

The first project will involve every year 6 and year 7 student who will get involved in regular litter picks within the ward of Bentilee. This will also be in partnership of any community groups willing to get involved.

The second project is for the students to sow wild flowers seeds to an unsightly area of land close to the main gates of the school entrance. This will enhance the pedestrian entrance to the school premises.

The third project is to introduce an Eco club. This will raise awareness of the importance of recycling all materials; have recycling stations including the introduction of water buts.

Final note from the chair

As chair of the group I am really proud of all the hard work put in by so many groups. We only had our first meeting in late 2017, and after a stuttering start while we found our feet we all helped one another with ideas, advice and encouragement. This is the first time we have entered the competition and the results are a testimony to the vibrant community spirit throughout the ward of Bentilee and Ubberley.
